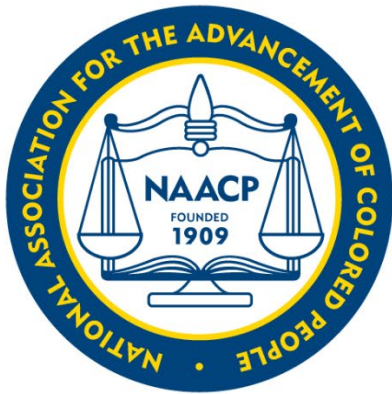

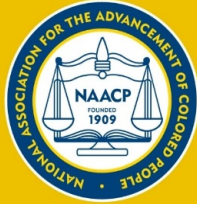

Highlights of the NAACP

The NAACP was created on the centennial celebration of the birth of the “Great Emancipator,” Abraham Lincoln on February 12, 1909. The atrocities committed against colored people in the Springfield, Illinois, riot during the summer of 1908 troubled the conscience of writer William English Walling of the Independent, a Springfield periodical. A wealthy Southerner and Socialist, Walling was moved to challenge freedom-loving Americans by invoking the spirit of the abolitionists who fought for social and political equality.

The local Drew County Branch of the NAACP #6042 was established in 1984 to extend the furtherance of the national objective. At the local branch, members endeavor to carry out the mission, vision and objectives of the national organization and the local branch.

Together with more than 2 million activists across the country we work to ensure the political, educational, social, and economic equality of rights of all persons and to eliminate racial hatred and racial discrimination.

She received her Bachelor's of Arts in Sociology from the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff and her Master's in Social Work from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock by the age of 22. She is a graduate of Leadership Pine Bluff and is the first to serve as chair of the Southeast Arkansas Region for Arkansas Gospel Music Heritage Month. She was recognized by the State Gospel Music Committee as a Living Legend in Arkansas. Mrs. Lancelin enjoys working with gospel choirs and as a result of that has directed and/or organized choirs for national recording stars such as Rance Allen, Shirley Ceasar, Dorothy Norwood, and Beverly Crawford in Arkansas.

Mrs. Lancelin is the recent widow to Gregory Lancelin. She is the proud mother of two amazing daughters, Deaquanita Lancelin & Nia Lancelin Brantly (Brooks). She's the proud grandmother of an adorable granddaughter, Amanze. She is a member of First Missionary Baptist Church where she directs the adult and youth choirs. She also serves on the Deaconess Board. She has even chaired the church's Special Events Committee in the past. She loves serving her community and using her talent as a speaker and in her music ministry all over the state of Arkansas and outside of the state as well. She serves as the choir director for Women United for Christ whom she loves working with. She has a passion for working with churches of all denominations and motivating those around her to a higher standard of excellence. She was fortunate to work with a team to help write a curriculum for children entitled "The Arkansas Approach Plan" which was used to educate children about the dangers of alcohol and drug use. Because of her commitment to helping young people she serves on the Juvenile Drug Court team under the Honorable Judge Earnest Brown Jr. where she provides clinical recommendations and treatment planning for youth suffering from substance use or behavioral health disorders.
